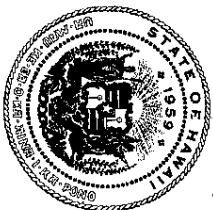
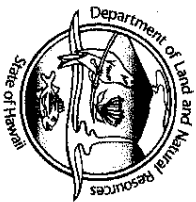

Forest Stewardship Project Proposal

Dear Ms. Green,

Thank you for your interest in the Hawaii Forest Stewardship Program (FSP) and the submission of a FSP project proposal for your property, TMK No. (3) 1-3-009:023. The Forest Stewardship Advisory Committee (FSAC) and the Division of Forestry and Wildlife reviewed your project proposal at FSAC meeting on January 24, 2014 in Hilo, Hawaii. I am pleased to inform you that your project proposal was accepted and you have been invited to development a FSP management plan. Your project has been approved for 50 percent cost-share assistance on the development of a FSP management plan not to exceed \$3,500.00.

This letter does NOT constitute an award of funds. Once all contractual and fiscal documents are finalized and approved, a purchase order will be issued for your project. If you proceed prior to a Notice to Proceed (e.g.: issuance of a purchase order), the State will not be liable for work, contract costs, expenses, loss of profits, reimbursements, or any damage whatsoever incurred by you or anyone you employ for this project. As a reminder, payments from FSP are reimbursements eligible for distribution once your FSP management plan has been approved. Additionally payments from the program may not equal more than 50 percent of actual costs expended for the project.
